Year 6 Camp



Uniform

Jewellery Is not permitted with the exception of sleepers or plain stud earrings and suitable watches. It is recommended that Year 1 and 2 children do not wear watches. Ankle or wrist bracelets, including 'friendship' style bracelets and necklaces are not to be worn.
