In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus wants people to know about the cost of being a disciple. "Whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple." Large crowds were travelling with Jesus so he spoke strongly to ensure nobody was just going along with him and the crowd without thinking.

Discipleship is personal. Jesus wants to speak to an individual in particular, not to people in general. Jesus wants us to know the scale of the task ahead of us; when it seems too much for us, what are we to do? To whom can we turn for help? How can we have the humility to ask God for help? We need to ask ourselves the question, are we just "going along" with Jesus or have we become His disciples?


