OUR FAITH

Sharing the Gospel. Luke 18: 9-14

In this Sunday's Gospel a Pharisee, obsessed by his own virtue, is contrasted with a tax collector who humbly asks God for mercy. The parable demonstrates the need to pray humbly. In it we are told of the tax collector going home 'justified' as his sins were forgiven, but not the Pharisee. Why was the outcast the one who experienced God's mercy and not the religious man? Jesus explains: "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Jesus cautions us against anything that elevates us or sets us apart from others. The tax collector asked for God's mercy and got it; the Pharisee didn't think he needed it, so he didn't bother to ask.

The parable reminds us that when we pray, we must remember the need for God in our lives. If we are too full of ourselves, there is little room for God's grace to work in us.


