Learning Space Placements for 2026

I wanted to reassure you of the process for your child's kaitiaki group placement at St Ignatius for 2026. When we choose groups for students, we are mindful of both the individual student needs and the overall group composition. Numbers of students in each year level mean that we do have to have some composite classes.

Teachers have a transition meeting at school so that the current teacher can hand over information to next year's teacher. This important information includes things such as any emotional support that may be needed, behaviour or learning support and anything else that is relevant. Children will have the opportunity to visit their next year's spaces in the last week of school.

At the beginning of the year you will be invited to Parent Sharing meetings where you can meet your child's teacher and share information with them. We will also have a Parent Information Session where more information about the school and the curriculum is provided.
