
Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday

OUR LEARNING

Parent Meetings

Thank you for making the time to come to meet with your child's teacher this week for the Parent Sharing meetings. This is a valuable opportunity to meet face to face and share information about your child. If you were unable to make it please contact the office or the teacher directly to book in a time.

Next week we will send out a copy of our school information that would normally be shared at a Term 1 Parent evening. The meeting will not be held this year due to it being such a short term and the many other things that are happening. Instead you will receive a copy of the presentation. You are welcome to let us know if you have any questions or require further clarification on anything at all. In the first instance check with your child's kaitiaki teacher and, if they can't answer anything, Mrs Watson or I should be able to help.

Bike Skills

Year 5 & 6 students were able to improve their skills this week thanks to the Bigfoot Adventures team who came in to run a programme that follows national Bike Skills Guidelines, covering bike safety check, clothing requirements and safe riding techniques. It was great to see the students learning to ride their bikes safely and confidently.

Biking to and from School

Year 6 students whose parents have completed the St. Ignatius Cycling Declaration may ride to/from school independently. The declaration can be collected from the office.

Year 5 children have an opportunity in Term Four to begin independently riding to school.

Younger children who want to ride to school will need to be accompanied by a caregiver.



Robotics

This week we started VEXGO robotics at St Ignatius. This is a stem based program. Hayden and Gethin really enjoyed it and completed the first stage. Next week they will extend what they have learnt to add motors and then code/program the car. VexGo is designed for Years 2-6 and many more children will get the opportunity to experience it thanks to the expertise of Ms Sarah Bugden, one of our amazing Learning Assistants who is also involved in robotics outside of school time.

Hapu Groups

This year we have added a new Hapu Group, Kohimarama Hapu. This is because the Hapu Groups will now be based on kaitiaki groups rather than year groups.

Hapu groups are the groups that we use when going to Hapu Mass and for Tuakana Terina classes that work together for things like Buddy Reading.

Te Waipuna collections are also done in Hapu Groups. For those of you who are new to the school we ask for dominations of food for the Te Waipuna basket which is located in the office. One Hapu Group a week brings in the food. Mrs Murphy sends out an email reminder about this so you will know when it is your turn. It will also be in the calendar. The donations are collected at the end of each week and delivered by generous school volunteers to the team at Te Waipuna Puawai who work helping those in need in the Glenn Innes, and wider Tamaki community. Suitable donations are things like weetbix or rice.

Please note the change of time. This is to allow students to get ready for a clean start of school at 8.50am.


Classes start on **Monday 16 February 2026**. The last session will be held on Monday 30 March 2026. There are a total of 7 sessions.
